Pub/ Restaurant on Campus	 Bronte Jones, Raymond Ou attended a previous meeting to talk about the feasibility of this Internal AU working group has been formed for this, tasks have been given, update on this soon. Timeline through the fall for working group, which is meeting weekly Feasibility study by the end of the semester.
Orientation Expansion	 Expansion of off-campus orientation to more students who live off campus Chuck: Are there student who are living on campus, attending parties off campus, and what benefit is there to giving on-campus students an orientation for off-campus etiquette? Is there a shorter orientation that can be given to students on campus? Are there other zip codes that need to be engaged? Or other swaths of land that should be focused on? Jeff: New students arriving fall 2024 started the semester with a 4-day orientation.

 If they are living off-campus they have to do the off-campus orientation Judith: What happens to students who live in group houses? Do they receive orientation? o First-year students do not usually live off campus, all students who live off-campus have to take the off-campus orientation. Coaches for sports teams help conversations and accountability opportunities when situations occur with athletes and in student athletes group houses. Chuck: Are there often cases where grad students are being reported? o Jeff: There has only been 1 complaint in the past 6 years for a law student Justin: I have had no grad student complaints. Looking to improve the process of responding to noise complaints off campus and learn from neighbors if AU's process was useful and/or if they were pleased with the outcome. Survey was determined to not be the best mode of outreach. Face to face conversations prioritized Phil: Maintaining robust follow-up process with neighbors across AU. Some engagements have not been face to face recently, but follow-ups have still been happening. Complaint Chuck: after Jeff/Justin work with students and neighbors on Follow-up complaints, they should bring to SLS reports of what worked and what didn't. Olivia to add as a standing agenda item "Student Conduct Report" and "Follow-up Report" directly after. Phil: Have a working group meeting that includes the conduct report data before the next CLC? Olivia to set up another working group meeting to go over the conduct report before the next CLC (Dec 10th) Several complaints for the same house Conduct • 7 complaints this period, 3 last year in the same time period. Report Laura to look into Chevy Chase zip code/inclusion of communities The last incident reported in Chevy Chase was in 2015.

	 Phil: Complaint follow-up observation. Quick action and collaboration have resulted in positive outcomes.
What are you interested in?	 Potential to expand the conversations in the working group while there are no major projects or campus plan discussions Chuck: Students in working groups would bring in new perspectives. Laura: Recent work with the Athlete Advisory Board, Student Athlete leaders meet regularly and may have insight into the things we talk about. It is expected of them to be engaged with community service. Judith: Having more neighbors put their voices into the partnership and expand the leadership on both the AU and community side. Chuck, Phil, Laura, and Jason to talk offline about this. Phil: Student affairs will want to know what the partnership would be talking to students about Phil and Jeff and Justin to talk offline with internal AU staff about student affairs Community engagement with student body (i.e. dinners with students at neighbors' homes, creating personal relationships with the student body)
Oct 22 Membership Meeting	 Opportunity to engage with the whole partnership on topics that touch more than one working group.
