IF YOU ARE ALREADY REGISTERED WITH THE ACADEMIC SUPPORT AND ACCESS CENTER

- Contact your Disability Access Advisor and put your specific accommodation in writing you are requesting for the student conduct process.
- Your Disability Access Advisor will review your request, consult with OSARP staff, and then determine what is a reasonable accommodation in this process.
- The Disability Access Advisor will communicate this accommodation to OSARP staff to implement during your conduct proceeding.



BUILT-IN SUPPORT THAT ALL STUDENTS RECEIVE IN THE CONDUCT PROCESS

- Time to prepare (disciplinary conferences = 3 days/disciplinary hearings = 5 days from notification), or you can request extra days with the OSARP staff if needed.
- Time to respond (students can request a few minutes to process a question & reply)
- Having an advisor to provide support (see Student Conduct Code, Section XI).
- Reviewing case materials to prepare.
